Preschool and Occasional Care provides a learning environment where skillful educators nurture each child's growth and well-being through play based learning. The implementation of our curriculum is underpinned by Belonging, Being and Becoming, the Early Years Learning Framework.

PRIMARY YEARS

A strong culture for success in the Junior School is reflected by the attitude of our staff to challenge our students to do their personal best at every opportunity. The core academic priorities of Literacy and Numeracy are presented in a manner that celebrates understanding, exploration and skill development which fosters areas of personal interest and growth. SENIOR YEARS (Years 10 to 12+)

As students enter Senior Schooling at Ocean View College, they begin to develop specialist pathways from their range of subjects. The College offers courses in SACE Stage 1 and 2 with increasing opportunities to specialise and individualise their programs with ongoing developments in Vocational Education and Training (VET) and online learning options.
